Montgomery County, home of Wabash College and known as the Cradle of Basketball, is seeking a dynamic, collaborative civil engineer to serve as the County Engineer who will build upon the successes of the past few years with over \$40 million being invested in public infrastructure to attract businesses and residents.

The County Engineer's duties include developing and implementing the bridge maintenance plan, collaborating with the Highway Department to develop the road maintenance plan, managing and updating the thoroughfare plan, advising elected officials and staff on matters related to infrastructure and supervising engineering consultants.

The ideal candidate will be able to collaborate with staff and elected officials to accomplish projects and will provide professional, objective advice and recommendations.

The County Engineer is appointed by the Board of Commissioners, reports to the County Administrator and is expected to work 37.5 hours a week with the opportunity for a flexible schedule.

Salary is dependent upon qualifications and the position will be open until filled.

Residency within the County is not required but is encouraged.
